Four Day Workshop on Spoken Language & Speech Analysis

We are happy to announce you that the Centre for Naga Tribal Language Studies (CNTLS) Nagaland University, Kohima campus, Meriema is going to organize a **4-days Workshop on Spoken Language and Speech Analysis** from 17th – 20th June, 2019 at Nagaland University, Kohima Campus in collaboration with IIT Guwahati. The workshop aims to equip the participants with the tools and software in speech analysis. The tentative topics that will cover during the workshop include:

- a) Introduction to Phonetics, Articulatory, Acoustic, Auditory, organ of Speech, Speech production, Articulation, place & manner, Speech production; glottal vibration, F0; use of F0, Hands on to PRAAT, speech recording
- b) Sounds of Naga & other TB languages, Source Filter Theory, F0, Harmonics, Formants, Intensity, Duration, Acoustic phonetics: Spectrogram, formants; F1-F2 of vowels
- c) Record isolated vowels, Classify a test vowel from F1-F2 plot, Influence of PoA on F2 of vowels ({left, right} context), Automatic Speech Recognition, Linguistic knowledge in ASR; Spoken language resources
- d) Linguistics field work & Data, Record digit sequences for building number recognition system, Guess the words by visually inspecting spectrograms, Neural networks for ASR and TTS, Applications of speech technology, Demonstrations of number recognition system

Registration Fees: Rs. 250 (Scholars/Students)

Selection of the participants will be made on the basis of first come first serve basis. Selected participants will be intimated by the organizing committee through mail or mobile.
