

### ***How to reach Lumami***

For anyone coming for the first time to Nagaland University, Hqrs. Lumami from outside the state of Nagaland, the nearest Railway station is Mariani, Assam and Jorhat is the nearest airport located in Assam. From both the places it takes four hours to reach Mokokchung town, Nagaland via the taxi. If your journey route touches Guwahati then there are direct Network & Blue Hills night bus services available to Mokokchung town which will drop you around 7:30 am-8:00 am (tickets available @ Paltan Bazar and Bus Moves from ISBT-Bethkuchi, near Balaji Temple). As you reach Mokokchung town, our volunteers will receive you at the dropping point and guide you to the Workshop venue.

### ***Last Date for Submission of Application***

20th March, 2024 is the last date for submission of application. Selected candidates would be intimated by e-mail on or before 22nd March, 2024.

### ***Registration Fee***

Registration fee is Rs 500, to be paid at the time of registration. The participants shall be provided accommodation if needed as well as the Workshop Kit, tea/coffee, lunch and snacks. Travel allowance by shortest distance (bus or train fare, sleeper class only) will be reimbursed to the outstation participants on submission of the original ticket, as per university rules.
