About the Workshop

The proposed intensive workshop aims to arm **research scholars** with the necessary basic techniques of academic reading and writing in the social sciences. Beginning with an introduction to the generic structure of academic texts, it has four sections devoted to:

- i) Techniques of reading: pre-reading, quick reading, detailed reading, dealing with difficult passages, and how to seek internal and external help.
- ii) Writing techniques: elements of coherence and structure, the distribution of emphasis, paragraphs, quotation and paraphrasing.
- iii) Formal conventions of academic texts: competency in citation and referencing, current definitions of plagiarism and how to avoid it.
- iv) Essentials of standard academic formats: research proposals, literature reviews, elements of "publishability", negotiating stylesheets, and writing for academic journals.

This is a practical workshop – it consists entirely of exercises designed to help participants learn-by-doing. The primary objective is to avoid lectures. Participants will be divided into small groups of 4-5 members who will do both collective and individual in-session exercises. There will be one faculty facilitator to guide 3-4 groups.

Rationale of the Workshop

The simple acts of reading and writing are central to academic practice in the social sciences and humanities. However, while these are formally discussed and taught in the humanities, it is only in the social sciences that something as integral to our disciplines as reading and writing are never taught explicitly. This is a major problem because reading or writing academic texts is very different from, and much more than, simply being competent in the reading or writing of ordinary or non-academic language.

In association with RC 01, Theory and Practice in Sociology, & Indian Sociological Society, the proposed workshop is designed to address a critical gap in the academic skill set of our researchers and faculty members, particularly in the areas of academic reading and writing. In the rapidly evolving academic landscape, the ability to dissect complex texts, synthesize information, and articulate research findings effectively is indispensable. This workshop aims to equip participants with advanced reading strategies, research methodologies, and writing techniques that are pivotal for producing high-quality academic papers, proposals, and dissertations. It will be a Hands-on Training Workshop for 5 days.

Resource Person is going to be **Prof. Satish Deshpande**, Former Professor and Head of the Department of Sociology, Delhi School of Economics, Delhi. Currently M.N. Srinivas Chair Visiting Professor, ISEC, Bengaluru.
