BACKGROUND

Disasters threaten the lives, constitutional rights and needs of the children worldwide. In past three decades India have faced devastating disasters such as Latur Earthquake (1993), Odisha Super Cyclone (1999), Bhuj Earthquake (2001), Indian Tsunami (2004), Jammu & Kashmir Earthquake (2005), Urban Flood in Mumbai (2005), Bihar Floods (2008), Uttarakhand Floods (2013), Cyclone Phailin (2013), Srinagar Flood (2014), Chennai Flood (2015), Kerala Flood (2018), and Cyclone Fani (2019).

Disasters adversely affecting women and children. During these emergencies, children are especially vulnerable to disease, malnutrition, and violence and trafficking. Measles, diarrhoea, acute respiratory infections, malaria and malnutrition are the major killers of children during humanitarian crises. In future, vulnerability of children is expected to increase as the intensity and frequency of natural disasters rises.
