## Nagaland

The state of Nagaland was formally inaugurated on December 1<sup>st</sup>, 1963 as the 16<sup>th</sup> state of the Indian union. It is bounded by Assam in the West, Myanmar (Burma) on the east, Arunachal Pradesh and part of Assam on the North and Manipur in the South. The State consists of 16 (Sixteen) Administrative Districts, inhabited by 17 major tribes along with other sub-tribes. Each tribe is distinct in character from the other in terms of customs, language and dress. It is a land of folklore passed down the generations through word of mouth. Here, music is an integral part of life; folk songs eulogising ancestors, the brave deeds of warriors and traditional heroes; poetic love songs immortalising ancient tragic love stories; Gospel songs that touch your soul (should you have a religious bend of mind) or the modern tunes rendered exquisitely to set your feet a-tapping.

## Nagaland University

Nagaland University the 13<sup>th</sup> Central University and the only Central University in Nagaland was established based on the Act of Parliament of India and received the assent of the President of India on 20<sup>th</sup> October 1989 as THE NAGALAND UNIVERSITY ACT 1989 (No. 35 of 1989) and came into force as notified in THE GAZETTE OF INDIA EXTRAORDINARY PART-II SECTION-1 in October 1989 published by the Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department), New Delhi. The University came into being on September 6, 1994 having jurisdiction over the entire state of Nagaland.

## Kohima Campus

The Kohima campus is spread over 240 acres and is located at Meriema, which is around 10 kms from the city centre. Kohima campus houses 11 departments and 2 centres, and caters to around 1000 Postgraduate and Doctoral students, and Research Scholars.



## Department of Psychology

The Department of Psychology was established in the year 2012 and the first batch of students to the MA program was admitted in the year 2013. The course structure for Masters Degree in Psychology has been designed to provide students with strong theoretical as well as practical orientations in the various domains of psychological science. Over the four semester course, students go for a Clinical Posting Program at the LGB Regional Institute of Mental Health (LGBRIMH), Tezpur, and to various Special Schools, Rehabilitations Centers, Orphanages, and Old Age Homes. The department has introduced Ph.D. programs in 2017 and PG Diploma in Counseling Psychology in 2023.

## Guidelines of Abstract Submission

1. All submissions must be original and should not be accepted or published or presented in any other conferences/journal.
2. Abstract text including the keywords should not exceed 250 words. Abstract must contain no fewer than 4 keywords.
3. Abstract must follow APA 7<sup>th</sup> edition format typed in English, font size 12, Times New Roman, double line spacing in MS word format. Papers not in the required format will be reverted back to the authors for rectification.
4. Details of the author/s (Name, Organization of affiliation, email address and phone number) must all be adequately specified.
5. Presentations must be indicated as ORAL or POSTER.
6. Abstract received after the due date will not be considered for presentations, souvenirs or journal publication.
7. Selected papers will be considered for publication in the special issue of the JIAAP.
