6. Eligibility Criteria to Appear for CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024

The candidates to be eligible to appear for CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024 should fulfill the following criteria:

- I. The candidate should be an Indian Citizen.
- II. The candidates must meet the Local/Non-local requirements in terms of laws laid down by the Government of Nagaland /State.

III. Educational Qualifications:

- a) Candidates who have completed Graduation or Post Graduation or any equivalent degree with 50 % (45% for SC/ST/PWD and other reserved categories as per the laws of Nagaland) in Science/Arts/Humanities/Commerce are eligible to apply for this programme.
- b) Candidates with engineering and technology degrees with 55% or equivalent grades and who have studied mathematics, physics, and chemistry as a special paper are also eligible for the programme in mathematics/science pedagogy.

However, final semester candidates are also eligible to apply for the programme, but admission will be confirmed only when they will produce the final semester pass mark sheet of UG with the above-mentioned required percentage at the time of counseling.

- c) Candidates having less than 50% (For SC/ST/PWD: 45%) or equivalent grade at the Graduation level will also be eligible if they have 50% marks or equivalent grade in a Post-Graduation degree or any other equivalent degree recognized by UGC.

Rounding off of 44.5-44.9 to 45 % or 49.5-49.9 to 50 % or 54.5 to 54.9 will not be accepted. The candidates must have secured a complete 45% or 50% or 55% (minimum criterion) or more than that for applying.

7. Eligibility Criteria for the Choice of Pedagogy for CET B.Ed. (NAGALAND)-2024 and Admission to B.Ed. Programme

- i. **Mathematics Pedagogy:** Candidates with B.A./B.Sc. in Mathematics or B.C.A. with Mathematics or B. Tech. with Mathematics & Physics comes under Mathematics Pedagogy.
- ii. **Science Pedagogy:** Candidates with B.Sc. or B.Sc. (Home Science) who have studied Botany and Zoology or Allied Life Sciences or B.C.A. Candidates with Sciences, Physical Sciences (Physics and Chemistry) come under Science Pedagogy.
- iii. **Social Science Pedagogy:** Candidates with B. A. (General, History, Political Science, Economics, Geography, and other than English). Candidates with B.Com./B.B.M./B.B.A. will come under Social Science Pedagogy.
- iv. **English Pedagogy:** Candidates with B.A. English/ Special English/Alternative English or M.A. English comes under English Pedagogy.

Note: At the time of filling out Online Application Forms for admission to CETB.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024, candidates must select the pedagogy subjects from among the

subjects studied at the graduation level. On filling the wrong pedagogy the application will be summarily rejected.

8. Medium of Entrance Test

The question paper of the entrance test will be in the English language only.

9. Districts for Centers of Entrance Test

The examination centers for Common Entrance Test will be in the following districts:

- i. Kohima**
- ii. Dimapur**
- iii. Mokokchung**

However, the Convener reserves the right to allot candidates to any other center (s) than the above-mentioned ones in unavoidable circumstances.

10. Qualifying Marks

There will be no cut-off/ qualifying marks for the results. A merit list will be prepared on the basis of the number of seats and entrance test marks. Admission will be given on the basis of merit secured by the candidates and the availability of the seats in the desired Pedagogy on the basis of their qualifications.

11. Results and Admission

(A) (RANKING: A Pedagogy-wise merit list will be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained by the candidates in CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024 entrance test/examination. Where there is a tie in total marks, Part-B (Two parts, Part-A and Part-B, in the question booklet) marks will be taken into account to decide relative ranking. In case of a further tie, the candidate who has applied first will be given priority and merit will be prepared on the basis of candidates' application number. The candidate with the earliest submission will get the highest ranking in the bracket.

The rank obtained in CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024 is valid for entry into B.Ed. programme for the academic year 2024-2026 only.

**** College allotment to the candidates will be done on the basis of his/her obtained rank in the merit list for the selected pedagogy. At the time of counseling for admission to B.Ed. programme seat will be allotted to a candidate as per the availability of a seat in the desired college along with his/her rank on the merit list.**

(B) Admission through seat and college allotment: On the day of admission through seat allotment in colleges, every candidate has to deposit Rs 500 as a counseling fee to attend the counseling for admission. The fee for confirming the seats in the B.Ed. colleges will be informed in the result (Merit list) and it will be adjusted in the semester fee by the college.

12. Scheme and Pattern of Entrance Examination for CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024

Question paper for CET B.Ed. (Nagaland)-2024 will have 100 questions. Each question will carry 1 mark. The duration of the test will be Two hours (2 hours). Part “A” will be common for all the candidates. This part will have 60 questions on General Awareness, Teaching Aptitude, Reasoning, and Language Proficiency in English as shown in the following table. Part “B” will be for Pedagogy Paper and it will have 40 questions from the related pedagogy and the questions will be of graduation level (Mathematics / Science/ Social Science/ English) syllabi of Nagaland University.

Part A of the question booklet will comprise of 60 questions in three parts. Q. No. 1 – Q. No. 20 will assess Teaching Aptitude. Q. No. 21 – Q. No. 40 will assess General Awareness and Reasoning and Q. No. 41 – Q. No. 60 will assess Language Proficiency in English.

Part B will have questions for pedagogy (Mathematics/Science/Social Science/English) selected by the candidate. It will have 40 questions from Q. No. 61 to Q. No. 100. It can be seen in the following table:
