Evidence of shared grammatical, phonological, syntactical, semantic, vocabulary, and discourse features demonstrates this blending, which arises from prolonged contact, migration, and cultural exchange. This unique linguistic landscape, enriched by centuries of cultural and historical layers, makes India one of the world's most captivating linguistic areas.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

This conference is a collaborative effort between the Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysuru, and the Department of Linguistics, Nagaland University, and is scheduled for February 13-14, 2025. It centers on Northeast India as a key example of a linguistic area, where language contact and multilingualism are everyday realities.
