ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO PG PROGRAMME

It is the policy of Nagaland University to offer equal educational opportunities to all qualified persons, provided required conditions are fulfilled by the applicant:

1. Eligible students for Major streams (internally or externally) will be given preference over General stream.
2. An applicant must have passed three-year Degree Course with Honors/Major with 50% marks and for General Stream students of Arts, Commerce and Science with 55% in the concerned subject in which admission is sought.
3. For admission to LL.M. course an applicant must have LL.B. degree with 55% of marks under 10+2+3 pattern or Five years integrated course under 10+2+5 pattern.
4. 5%marks relaxation for SC/ST/OBC (NCL)/PwD category will be considered.
5. Applicants who have graduated from Colleges (Private/Govt./Autonomous) affiliated to Nagaland University shall be entitled to 10% weight-age of Bonus marks over others. For instance, a candidate who had passed out from any College affiliated to Nagaland University with 60% marks in graduation will get 6% as additional weight- age and his/her total percentage will become 66% while drawing the merit index of selection.
6. The number of seats available for admission to each Department will depend upon seats authorized by the University.
7. Reservation Policy-Reservation in courses offered by Nagaland University shall be as per the laid down norms/rules of GoI and Nagaland University.

Note:

1. Application for admission under sports' quota and Employees' quota should be routed through the respective Head of Department and Departmental Admission Committee in order of merit.
2. Only spouse/children of an employee of regular University may be included under Employees' quota.
3. When the seats reserved for different categories are not filled, the same may be allotted to the indigenous ST candidates. However, due care should be taken to ensure that the eligibility of deserving candidates under various categories are accommodated before the seats are allotted to indigenous STs.
4. For admission in M.Sc. (Anthropology) candidates with B.Sc. degree in science subjects (even without Anthropology) with an aggregate percentage of 50 or more percentage from Nagaland University or any other UGC recognized university shall be considered. However, candidates who have taken Anthropology at UG level will be given preference.
5. For admission in M.A. (Rural Dev. & Planning) candidates with B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/BBA (except Language background) with an aggregate percentage of 50 or more percentage from Nagaland University or any other UGC recognized university shall be considered.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO PHD PROGRAMME

1. Eligibility:

Subject to the conditions stipulated in the UGC Regulations and Ordinance of Nagaland University; the following persons are eligible to seek admission to the Ph. D programme:

- i. Candidates for admission to the Ph.D programme shall have a Master's Degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's Degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions.
- ii. A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/ Differently abled and other categories of candidate as per the decision of the Commission from time to time, or for those who had obtained their master's degree prior to 19th September 1991. The eligibility marks of 55% (for an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark procedures.
- iii. Candidates who have cleared the M.Phil. Course Work with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever the grading system is followed) and successfully completing the M.Phil. Degree shall be eligible to do research work leading to the Ph.D Degree. A relaxation of 5% of marks from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non- creamy layer)/ Differently abled and other categories of candidate as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
- iv. A candidate, whose M.Phil. Dissertation has been evaluated, and the viva voce is pending, may be admitted to the PhD programme of the same Institution.
- v. Candidates possessing a Degree considered equivalent to M.Phil. Degree of an Indian Institution, from a Foreign Institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to Ph.D programme.

2. Additional weightage during the Selection Process:

- i. Persons with M.Phil. Degree from Nagaland University.
- ii. Candidates qualified in any of the National Eligibility Test (NET), recognized by the UGC.
- iii. Candidates with JRF.
- iv. Candidates securing an average 'A' grade of 60% and above in the course work of M.Phil Programme of Nagaland University.
- v. Subject to availability of seats, candidates belonging to the following categories and fulfilling the criteria stipulated under clause 1 above, may also be admitted on the recommendation of the Department:
 - a. Regular employees of Nagaland University.
 - b. Teachers of colleges affiliated to Nagaland University with an experience of at least Three (3) years of continuous service.
 - c. Persons with at least 9 (nine) years of experience in Administration and Management and having specialized knowledge in the proposed field of research to the satisfaction of the department concerned.
 - d. Persons who have completed at least one year of research in a University/Institution after his/her registration, provisional or otherwise, under the supervision of a teacher.

3. UGC Regulations/ Guidelines and Nagaland University Ordinance:

Procedure for the admission and award of Ph.D Degree shall be in accordance with the UGC Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of Ph.D Degree Regulation 2022, and the Ordinance of Nagaland University. Subsequent amendments in the University Ordinance/UGC guidelines, if any, shall be followed as and when such changes are made/ notified.

4. Reservation Policy

Reservation in courses offered by Nagaland University shall be as per the laid down norms/rules of GoI and Nagaland University.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO PG DIPLOMA & CERTIFICATE COURSES

- 1. PG Diploma in Linguistics:**
Bachelor's degree in any stream/subject from any UGC recognized University/Institute having 45% marks for GEN./OBC category and 40% for SC/ST category.
- 2. PG Diploma in Hindi Teaching:**
Bachelor's degree in any stream/subject from any UGC recognized University/Institute.
- 3. Certificate in Spoken English:**
Minimum eligibility for admissions shall be Higher Secondary.
- 4. PG Certificate in Spoken English & Writing Skills:**
Minimum eligibility for admission shall be a bachelor's degree in any discipline.
- 5. One Year Diploma Course in Tenyidie:**
Class12 with knowledge of spoken Tenyidie.
- 6. Six Months Certificate in Tenyidie:**
Class12 with knowledge of spoken Tenyidie.
- 7. Three Months Diploma Course in Tenyidie for International Students:**
Class12 with English spoken skills.
- 8. One Crash Course in Spoken Tenyidie:**
No bar in educational qualifications. However, candidates with some English-speaking skill are preferable.
- 9. Three Months certificate course on (i) Industrial Microbiology and (ii) Aquaculture:**
Class12 with English spoken skills.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Applicants can apply **ONLY** through **Online Mode** of application.
2. Online Application Fee Payment:
 - i. All applicants must pay their application fees of Rs.200/-in case of General category and Rs.150/-in case of SC/ST/OBC category through SBI-iCollect/payment gate as specified in the online application form using Debit card/Credit card/Net Banking/UPI
(NO APPLICATION FEE SHALL BE REQUIRED FOR PWDS CANDIDATES)
A payment acknowledgment slip/receipt should be downloaded from the SBI-iCollect for reference purposes. Transaction charges are not part of the Fee.
 - ii. The Fee deposited through Credit Card/Debit Card/Net Banking/UPI in the SBI I-Collect will normally reach the University account after 24 hrs. Hence, it is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure that the fee is deposited well in time. Nagaland University shall neither be responsible for any delay in receipt of the payment nor shall be responsible if the payment is refused or declined by the Bank. Candidates are **STRONGLY** advised to submit the fee well before the last date.
 - iii. All amount(s) paid by the Applicant, for application to the programme offered by Nagaland University shall stand appropriate.
 - iv. If applying to more than one department/program, separate application forms need to be submitted as well as separate payments have to be made. The same payment receipt should not be used for applying to more than one department. If such cases are discovered, the application forms will be rejected without any further communication to the applicant.
3. Online Application
 - i. Once the application fee payment process is over, applicants must go to Nagaland University Online Application portal.
 - ii. Before getting into filling up of the Online Application form, candidates must keep ready the Application Fee Payment Receipt for reference number, scanned copies of passport photograph and documents (Academic documents, SC/ST/OBC-Central & Non-Creamy/ Candidates from Jammu & Kashmir/PWD/EWS as per applicability etc.) for uploading them.
 - iii. All required information should be correctly filled in the space provided.
 - iv. Appropriate document(s) must be uploaded against the queried information.

- v. A candidate may apply separately to a maximum of three (03) relevant departments by paying the Online Application fees separately. However, admission can be taken ONLY in one Department, even though selected for admission in more than one department.
4. Online Application Form Submission
- i. Applicants must agree with the given declaration by choosing the options provided on the Declaration by the Candidate box before clicking on the submit button.
 - ii. It is important to take note that once applicants press the submit button, they cannot alter/change anything under any circumstances. Therefore, applicants are advised to be sure about the accuracy and relevancy of the given / uploaded information before clicking the submit button.
5. Admission Test/Interview
- Admission Test/Interview shall be conducted by the respective departments. Related information shall be uploaded in the University website from time to time. Applicants are instructed to keep regular watch for the same. The University shall not be liable if an applicant fails to comply with the schedules.
6. Regarding Admission related matters, the decision of the Nagaland University shall be final.
7. All disputes/litigation regarding admission related shall lie within the jurisdiction of the Guwahati High Court, Kohima Bench.

1. About the Department:

The Department was established in September 1983 in the premises of Kohima Science College, Jotsoma as the Post-Graduate Department of Geology of the erstwhile NEHU. Further, it was taken over by Nagaland University since its inception on 6th September, 1994. On 10th April 2010, the Department was shifted to its permanent Kohima Campus at Meriema.

The Department of Geology is the first Science Department under the Nagaland University to receive the Research Grant from the Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi for Level-I support under the “Fund for Improvement of Science & Technology” Infrastructure in Universities and Higher Educational Institutions Program (DST-FIST) in 2001. Based on the performance of the Department and Students’ placement, the Department of Science & Technology further supported the Department by granting Rs. 50 Lakh under the DST-FIST Level-I Program again in September 2013. The Department has completed 17 major Research Projects funded by the DST, ISRO and Oil India Limited, 3 minor Research Projects and 5 Consultancies (ADB, JICA-Japan and Nagaland Govt.). To enhance the quality of teaching and research, the existing laboratory facilities have also been upgraded by procuring high-end equipments such as Advanced Leica Research Microscope, Student Model Leica Microscopes, Hot Air Oven, Muffle Furnace and geophysical Survey equipments etc. In addition, an extensive sampling expedition was undertaken in the Ophiolites and Metamorphics of Kiphire and Meluri districts of Nagaland to supplement the representative samples to the museum of the department. Further, some representative rock and mineral samples have also been donated for display in the

Rocks and Minerals Gallery of the Nagaland State government Museum at Kohima.

The Department offers the only dedicated course in Master of Laws (LL.M) in the state of Nagaland. The Department started with three faculties in 2020. 1. About the Department: The Department primarily undertakes research on the history of ethnic communities, spanning the pre-colonial period to contemporary era. To meet one of these aims, Archaeology is introduced in the History curriculum to aid Post-Graduate students and PhD students in the study of the region's historic and prehistoric past. The Two-Year Master of Arts program in History & Archaeology offers a curriculum incorporating both the discipline of History and Archaeology. The main objective of the curriculum is directed towards imparting knowledge to students on the ideas of history and its epistemology, world history, Indian and regional histories with emphasis on various historical sources, archaeology being one of such sources vital for reconstructing the past of preliterate oral societies. In doing so, the curriculum attempts to promote and provide critical insights to the history of humanity and cultural heritage.

1. From an overview standpoint of the courses offered, papers are directed towards basic fundamental methodologies that historians and archaeologists employ in the study of the past, thus helping students to acquire and demonstrate skills in the critical analysis of primary and secondary historical sources

2. The courses also seek to appraise students on historiographical theories and debates in the field of historical research. Such a course is vital to train students of history in both theoretical and conceptual developments in historiography.

3. The course thus intends to introduce students to the intricacies of history as a discipline and evolution of myriad of tradition of historical writings.

4. In general, the objective of all the Courses will help impart knowledge of the history, both 'western' and 'non-western', their change over time, of different regions of the world, including the Indian Subcontinent and Northeast India, in particular.

5. A portion of the course is also aimed at introducing students of history to the discipline of Archaeology – the nature of archaeological data, its methods and the multidisciplinary approaches to the study of past societies and their historical developments. With the basic fundamental background of Archaeology in the Under-Graduate level, its course at the Master Program is essentially designed to introduce students of history to the fundamentals of prehistory, prehistoric tool technology and the role of palaeo environment within which prehistoric cultures evolved.

6. The Archaeology section of the course also explores some of the major themes of our human past, beginning from evolution of early hominids to the origins of agriculture and animal domestication. In addition, the museology course is also designed to introduce students of Ancient Indian History to the history, role and significance of museum-collections and display of material culture/artefacts in the dissemination of knowledge of cultural values among different groups of people and as centres of research for the study and reconstruction, particularly of extant (or in the process of becoming so) cultures and ways of life. Emphasis is given to ethnographic museums which are especially relevant to the region of Northeast India. Such collections have a universal appeal in their capacity to illustrate the human endeavour to adapt to different environmental conditions and also facilitate the comparative study of human's reaction to common problems in various natural settings.

7. Keeping in focus the interdisciplinary objective of the curriculum, both papers of History and Archaeology are incorporated in the Two-Year Master of Arts Degree program in the

Department of History & Archaeology, NU. All Four Papers each are essential Core Papers in the First and Second Semester, while in the Third and Fourth Semester; students are given the choice to opt from Elective Courses. Choice-Based Credit Papers are also incorporated in the Third and Fourth Semesters for students of various Departments within the School of Social Sciences.

1. About the Department:

The Department of Management under the School of Management Studies (SMS) was inaugurated on the 29th of October 2007. The Department of Management is the only Department under the said School at present. The Department of Management is growing with time and presently it has its own computer lab with LAN connection, WiFi, digital smart board, LCD Projectors etc. The campus library possesses good collection of Management books and journals, and more books have been added to its library over the last few years. The department also has an active Alumni Association. Admission to the MBA Programme is done on the basis of MAT conducted by AIMA, CMAT (AICTE) and CUET (PG). This is done in order to maintain its standard by selecting the right kind of students. In addition to that, the department also conducts NU-MAT which is of equivalent standard of National level tests for admission to the MBA Programme. The department is functioning now from Kohima Campus of the University since July, 2016.

Vision: **“To strive to achieve excellence in management education through teaching, research and consultancy.”**

The department has been running the Ph.D. program since the academic session 2018-19. Currently, one research scholar has been awarded PhD and another fifteen are undergoing Ph.D. The department completed two projects worth Rs 8 Lakh sponsored by the Directorate of Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of Nagaland. MULTIDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH CENTRE (MDRC)

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 (hereafter referred to as NEP) recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal well-being and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution - a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. It notes that “given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals”.

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP)” incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options. This will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

In the process of the fulfilment of the set objectives of the University, and guidelines laid down in NEP-2020, Nagaland University has taken a significant step to establish a Multidisciplinary Studies & Research Centre (MDRC) that serves as a dynamic and thriving environment for fostering progress in research, innovation, product development, and the practical application of science and technology. The MDRC is proposed with an aim for Multidisciplinary collaboration among faculty members and students which can lead to innovative research breakthrough. It also aims to bridge the gap between research and practical application by actively engaging in cutting-edge research and development endeavour’s.

Programmes Offered:

1. 4-years multidisciplinary undergraduate B.Sc.(Honors) and B.Sc.(Honors with Research) programmes in Botany/Chemistry/Physics/Mathematics/Zoology (w.e.f. academic year 2025-26) with Multiple entry and Exit option, on completion of 10+2 level of education.
2. Ph.D. Programmes in all Disciplines with an emphasis on the topics of Multidisciplinary research.

Admission Eligibility:

A. Under-graduate programmes:

1. For admission to Undergraduate programmes, a candidate must secure first class (60%) in 10+2 (Science) examination or any other equivalent examination from any recognized university/board. 5% marks relaxation for SC/ST /OBC (NCL)/PwD category shall be considered.
2. A candidate must have a valid CUET (UG) score card in the relevant discipline before submitting an application.

B. Ph.D. Programmes:

The eligibility criteria for admission to Ph.D. programmes of the MDRC are as per the UGC Regulations and Nagaland University norms.

Intake capacity:

The Undergraduate Programmes shall be started with an initial intake capacity of 50 students during the academic year 2025-26. However the intake capacity is subject to change depending on the demand.

The intake capacity to the Ph.D. programmes shall be as per the norms of the UGC and Nagaland University. The Associate/adjunct faculty of the centre are encouraged to take the Ph.D. students from MDRC


Sports

Kilangla Jamir as the Convener with sub-committee members from each Campus.

Anti-Ragging Measures: The University is committed to preventing ragging, and an anti-ragging Committee has been constituted on each campus of the university in accordance with the relevant Supreme Court guidelines. Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, within the campus or outside, and as per the provisions of the Act of the Central Government and the State Government, strict action shall be taken against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.

Ragging is a cognizable offence under the law and is prohibited in all its forms

Equal Opportunity Cell: The University has Equal Opportunity Cell to facilitate the deprived groups for learning and creating space to the mainstream providing opportunities for them to be in the mainstream, at par with others. The Cell provides coaching for ST/SC/OBC (non-Creamy layer) and minorities to enhance employment opportunity.

SC/ST: The SC/ST Cell was established to supervise the implementation of the Reservation Policy of the Government of India. It assists in the conduct of various coaching schemes for SC/ST/OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) and minority community students.

Anti-Ragging: The University has Anti-Ragging Committee in all Campuses for curbing the menace of ragging in the University.

Grievance Redressal Cell: The University has appointed Nodal Officers for online Students Grievance Redressal Portal for curbing students' grievances.

Training and Placement Cell: Nagaland University has a 'Training and Placement Cell' headed by a faculty as in-Charge in each of the Three campuses and for which a Committee was constituted headed by a Senior Professor along with faculty-in-charge in all the campuses as members.

NET Coaching for SC/ST/OBC: The University gives NET coaching to the SC/ST/OBC (Non-Creamy layer) categories for enhancement of knowledge to appear for NET or SET examination.

Students' Representative in University Academic Council: One Post-graduate student from science and one from Humanities & Education and one from Research Scholars are selected on academic merit as per the ordinance of the University to represent in the Academic Council.

Gender Champion: Nagaland University has selected four teachers as Nodal Teachers (Campus-wise) to facilitate the activities in the respective campus of the University and fourteen students as Gender Champions to create an environment that fosters equal treatment.

NSS Cell: The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a public service program under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India. It aims to develop the Personality of students through community service and by promoting a sense of social and civic responsibility. Nagaland University Kohima campus has two (2) units of NSS. Students are encouraged to enroll in NSS voluntarily. NSS units organize a variety of activities throughout the year like community service, Awareness Campaigns, Skill Development, and Special Camps in which intensive community service activities must be performed. These camps are often held in rural areas and may focus on themes such as:

- Health and hygiene
- Education and literacy
- Environmental conservation
- Rural development
- Roles and Responsibilities

Cultural Club (NUKCM): For the holistic educational development of a learner, the Cultural Club in Kohima Campus, Nagaland University, was set up to help the students keep in touch with the cultural values, customs, and traditions of Nagaland. The aim of the club is not only to mould the personality of the learners but also to cater to the creative needs of the students, promote accessibility, and foster a dynamic cultural heritage that is preserved, used, and developed. The club endeavor to work towards promoting a vibrant campus experience through organizing innumerable activities pertaining to but not limited to the performing arts and cultural activities. The club's objective is that by bringing people from all walks, interests, and ethnicities, the learners would come together in ways that stimulate lifelong learning and community interaction and thereby develop their intellectual, organizational and social skills.

Students' Union: Students' Union Election is conducted every year for selection of Office bearers of the union.

PM-Vidyalaxmi Scheme:

The Union Cabinet on 6th November 2024 approved “Pradhan Mantri Vidyalaxmi” (PM-Vidyalaxmi), a Central Sector Scheme to financial support meritorious students so that financial constraints do not prevent any youth of India from pursuing quality higher education. The broad contours of the scheme are:

- A mission mode mechanism will facilitate and drive the extension of education loans to meritorious students who get admission in the top 860 quality Higher Educational Institutions (QHEIs) of the nation, translating to covering more than 22 lakh students every year.
- A special loan product will enable collateral free, guarantor free education loans; made accessible through a simple, transparent, student-friendly and entirely digital application process.
- Loan amounts up to ₹7.5 lakhs, will be provided a 75% credit guarantee by the Government of India to support banks to expand coverage.
- Furthermore, for students with up to Rs. 8 lakhs annual family income, the scheme will also provide for 3% interest subvention on loans up to Rs 10 lakh.
- This is in addition to the full interest subvention already offered to students with up to Rs. 4.5 lakhs annual family income.
- The Scheme is applicable for all Scheduled Banks/Regional Rural Banks (RRBs)/Cooperative Banks.
